family. I felt so blessed and thankful that these people are involved in this mission!



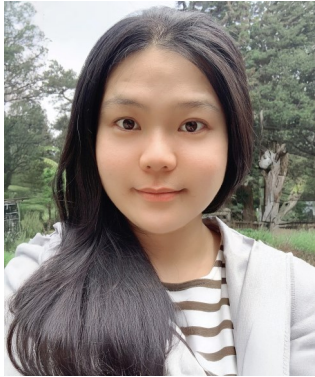

UPDATES FROM THE JULY 2024 TRUSTEE MEETING

Operations Overview

Books

Overall, Urantia Foundation's book business showed growth in several areas despite some fluctuations. Total book distribution in Q2 increased 11% over Q2 2023, and YTD book distribution increased 12%.

English sales are performing exceptionally well, with a significant 26% increase in Q2 and a 4% increase year-to-date. French sales are also bouncing back now that the inventory has been replenished, with Q2 sales up by 142% and year-to-date sales up 35%.

While some areas like Portuguese and Spanish sales have faced challenges in Q2, the Portuguese market still shows strong year-to-date growth at 24%. Efforts will be made in the coming quarter to identify

opportunities for more growth in the regions where these titles sell.

The strong start in book sales for the first half of 2024 is indeed encouraging. Overall, 41,054 Urantia Books—physical and electronic—have been sent into the world, and the team will continue its work to increase distribution next quarter.

Education

Participants in the June "Marriage and Family Adventure! An Online Symposium" shared their thoughts on having participated in the project. Tamara Strumfeld offered the opening prayer on both mornings and participated as a panelist. Gard Jameson, Olga López, and Chris Wood were all presenters, some serving as panelists as well. Although we had hoped for higher attendance, the seminar was both meaningful and timely. The sessions were recorded and are now available for viewing on YouTube. [Click here.](#)

Olga López gave a verbal summary of the Urantia Book International School (UBIS) written report. In April, 225 students were enrolled in 18 classes, which were facilitated by 24 volunteers from 6 language branches. Completion rates were typical, with 68% earning a Certificate of Completion. The 2023–

2024 academic year wrapped up with a global meeting on June 22.

Olga was recently named manager of the English branch, handing over the management of the Spanish branch to Erika Webster after many years of service. Her goal is to cohere the English group and work with Joanne Strobel to gain a comprehensive understanding of UBIS. Olga noted that the program has proven to be an incubator for leadership development. UBIS now has an impressive roster of 73 trained teacher-facilitators from around the world.

Tamara Strumfeld reported on the activities of the Urantia Book Study Group Directory. With so much automated now, the work required is mainly to answer reader inquiries. Several international volunteers were enlisted to help contact study groups for the annual cleanup, and that task has been completed. There has been a lull in the growth of study groups, so committee members will meet to discuss ways to generate interest. [Click here to visit the Urantia Book Study Group Directory.](#)

Fundraising and Finances

- Q2 unrestricted donations were 22% above Q2 of 2023 and 26% above Q2 budget.

- Restricted donations were 3% below Q2 of 2023 and 1% above Q2 budget.

- Q2 estate gifts totaled \$208,188.

- Total income increased by 3% compared to Q2 of 2023 and was 9% over budget.

- Administrative expenses increased by 17% compared to Q2 of last year but are 2% below the projected budget.

- Total expenses decreased by 1% from Q2 of 2023 and are 18% under budget.

Mustard Seed Grants Program (MSGP)

Sherry Cathcart Chavis reported on the status of grant awards and their current progress.

The second round for 2024 began on July 31 with a call for proposals. The submission deadline was September 11. Awards for this round will be announced in the next newsletter.

Cultural Advisory Council (CAC)

The Foundation's Cultural Advisory Council is an ongoing effort to bring awareness from diverse cultures around the world to the board, and in turn, bring greater understanding of the Foundation to these communities. Mr. Felipe Arrigorriaga from

Santiago, Chile, gave an hour-long presentation on the beauty of his country, including a brief history lesson, after which he shared his perspective on disseminating *The Urantia Book* in Chile. He shared what drew him to the book in 2004, what he feels is essential to make it more widely available in Chile, and what will bring current readers together.

Governance

The Expanded Board of Urantia Foundation will include a five-year strategic planning session as part of their October quarterly meeting. The schedule will

be similar to that of the 2019 planning session and will be modified to include more goals and strategy and fewer tactics. Joanne Strobel will facilitate the planning meeting for the board.

Translations

Georges Michelson-Dupont presented his 103rd Translation Report to the board. He reported on the following: the near completion of the Farsi translation, the Portuguese revision undergoing a review, and the progress of the Esperanto and Filipino translations.

The board was updated on the status of the Spanish Translation and Revision research project conducted by Ipsos Ciesmori, a Bolivian research company. Their team conducted a three-part plan: interviewing focus groups, collecting feedback, and gathering information from a survey of Spanish readers. The project is coming to completion, and we expect a final report from the company in the upcoming months.

Website

Tamara Strumfeld's full report on the Foundation's

new website included a narrative detailing the tremendous task of bringing the website to launch ready. She thanked the staff who stepped up to make the launch successful. The board was treated to a "park ranger" walk-through of the website, compliments of Brad Garner—Urantia Foundation's digital programs manager—wherein members offered suggestions and were apprised of ongoing efforts for further improvements.

PASSING THE TORCH—CHANGE IS IN THE AIR AT URANTIA BOOK INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL

Editor's Note: In mid-1998, Georges shared his ideas of harnessing the outreach potential of the nascent

World Wide Web with Dorothy Elder. As a retired educator, Dorothy immediately embraced Georges's vision to offer options to isolated Urantia Book readers around the world, and proceeded to found the Urantia Book Internet School. After a solid twelve years of steady growth, Dorothy retired and handed the reins to Georges. Under his benevolent guidance and a strategic ten-year expansion plan, UBIS continued to grow and thrive. Trained volunteers now span the globe, offering free online courses to fellow readers in seven languages, with more to come. Twenty-five years later, UBIS (now called

Urantia Book International School) is recognized as an efficient, effective, and far-reaching educational outreach service to students of The Urantia Book around the world!

After 14 years at the head of Urantia Book International School (UBIS), it pleases me to pass the torch to my dear friend and sister in spirit, Olga López of Barcelona, Spain, to succeed me as the UBIS liaison to the trustees of Urantia Foundation. Olga will oversee the continued development of our online school, seeking out the highest quality courses which offer students around the world an

opportunity to study *The Urantia Book* in their own language, within a culturally diverse environment.

Decades of Leadership

Olga has been a reader since 1995. She learned about *The Urantia Book*

through the novels of J. J. Benítez, and eagerly searched for the source of such extraordinary information about the organization of the universes and the life of Jesus. Since that time, spreading the teachings has been her passion.

In 1998 Olga attended her first conference in Spain. From 2004 to 2012 she was the president of Urantia Association of Spain. She also served as an associate trustee of Urantia Foundation from 2008 to 2012.

Olga joined the UBIS board in 2011 and committed to organize a Spanish branch. Starting as the sole Spanish-speaking teacher-facilitator, Olga trained and mentored a loyal and enthusiastic group of volunteers who formed committees tasked with preparing, reviewing, and scheduling the courses for

each term. Today the Spanish branch offers five courses of varying levels and topics each trimester, as well as a monthly UBIS Spotlight Series for Spanish speakers.

A Bit of History

The long and varied history of UBIS spans 25 years since its inception in 1999 by founder Dorothy Elder. It was the first online school devoted exclusively to facilitate study of *The Urantia Book*. By the time I replaced Dorothy at the helm in 2010, UBIS was firmly rooted in a solid foundation, thus enabling us to evolve into the more decentralized and international school of today.

THE CULTURAL ADVISORY COUNCIL WELCOMES CHILE

Editor's Note: Felipe lives in the capital of Chile, where he works as an independent publicist. He found The Urantia Book in 2004 and says it changed his life. He is dedicated to promoting the book in Chile through book fairs and spiritual festivals, and he has attended several international conferences. He helped form the first Chilean Association of readers of The Urantia Book, and also collaborates with the Urantia Book Fellowship.

Located south of Peru and wedged between the Andes Mountains to the east and the Pacific Ocean to the west, Chile is a long and narrow country that stretches 4,000 miles along the western edge of South America. If you were to turn Chile upside down, it would run from the northern tip of Alaska to the end of the Baja Peninsula of Mexico.

Chile is geographically diverse. The Atacama Desert, known as the driest place on earth, is a virtually rainless plateau made up of

salt basins and lava flows. Located in the northern part of Chile, it stretches over 600 miles along the Pacific Coast. The Atacama Desert is a popular spot for astronomers and tourists alike. The clear skies offer spectacular views of the Milky Way galaxy.

This contrasts with the lush forests, glacial lakes, and volcanoes of the southern Andes region. If you were to be transported to Patagonia, you might think that you were in the fjords that are found in Alaska and along the coast down to Seattle. It is sparsely inhabited, with alpacas and guanacos running wild. This beautiful area of Chile has mountains, bays, many islands, and national parks. Tierra del Fuego is the jumping-off point to Antarctica.

In section 5 of Paper 78, "The Andite Migrations," we learn that the Andites set off from Japan in open boats and landed on Easter Island, which since 1887 is considered part of Chile, and set up their religious and administrative center. Only 132 ever made it to the mainland of South America and established the ancestry of the later rulers of the Incas. Easter Island is a world-famous tourist destination because of the giant moai statues. The current mayor of Easter Island, which is also named Isla de Pascua, is a devoted Urantia Book reader.

Chilean culture is like a rich tapestry, with indigenous roots interwoven with Spanish colonial influences. The warm and welcoming

people are known for their hospitality and strong sense of national pride. The vast majority of Chileans are Christians—around 70% Catholic and 17% Protestant. Minority religions include Islam, Judaism, Hinduism, and Buddhism. Our culture emphasizes family values and respect for elders.

Chile is one of the most developed nations in South America, with a stable democracy and a prosperous economy that is driven by mining (especially copper), agriculture, fishing, and, increasingly, the technology and services sectors. Wine production is also significant, as Chilean wines gain international recognition. Tourists are attracted to the vibrant urban life of Santiago, natural wonders such as Torres del Paine National Park, and Elqui Valley for stargazing. Adventure lovers flock to the Andes for skiing, hiking, and climbing.

There have been Urantia Book reading groups in Chile since the 1980s. The Asociación Urantia del Cono Sur was formed in 1999

with readers from Argentina, Bolivia, Chile, Peru, and Uruguay. This organization eventually became inactive due to the challenges of maintaining a cohesive governing board with leaders from so many countries. But the local Urantia movement continued to thrive, with readers attending book fairs and spiritual festivals. Ricardo Roselló began the efforts to form a new Chilean association, and I succeeded him a year ago. The new association was announced in March during the 2024 Urantia Association International Conference in Baltimore, and we look forward to hosting our own conference next year.

I am so happy to represent my country on the Cultural Advisory Council. I hope to learn about other cultures and discover what is happening with *The Urantia Book* in other countries. It gives me great pleasure to share what we are doing in Chile to make *The Urantia Book* known. I am passionate about this great and wonderful mission!

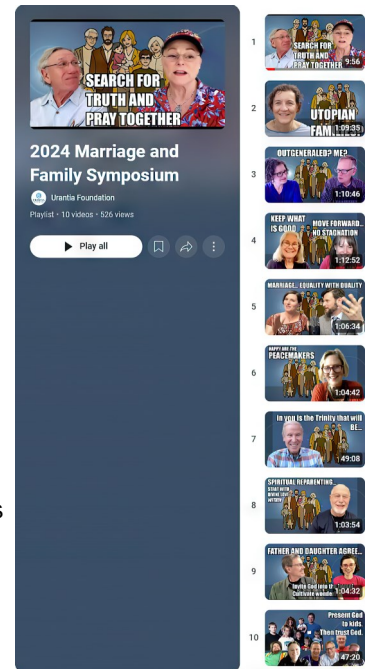

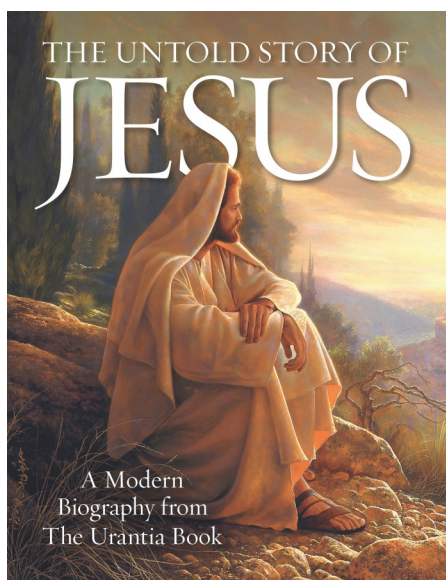

Urantia Association Presents **The Fourth European Conference, Paris, France** **Theme: The Distributivity of God: Man as God's Heir** **June 6-9, 2025**

It is good to tell people, "You are formidable and unique, and both the world and the Universe need you!" But can you really explain why? *The Urantia Book* offers us a new cosmology of the universe, one in which the Universal Father is the Architect-Designer-Creator. To this end:

It would seem that the Father, back in eternity, inaugurated a policy of profound self-distribution. There is inherent in the selfless, loving, and lovable nature of the Universal Father something which causes him to reserve to himself the exercise of only those powers and that authority which he apparently finds it impossible to delegate or to bestow. 10:1.1 (108.4)
